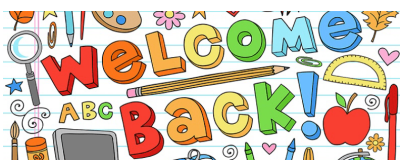

Transitions are crucial in early childhood because positive transitions foster a child's emotional well-being and foundational life skills like resilience and self-regulation. They build secure attachments, promoting competence and a sense of belonging.

Can I please remind you that the transition into our ELC will be made on an individual basis and to meet the needs of your child. Some children may settle quickly and attend full sessions and others may build this up over a period of time. We will plan this around what is best for your child.

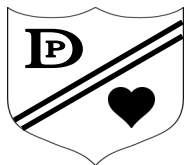

LEARNING EXPERIENCES

Each month we will be sending home an overview of the core skills that we will be aiming to cover within the ELC, this will be sent along with the newsletter.

Hopefully it will give you a greater insight into the ELC curriculum and allow you to see how your child's learning journal is linked to our planning.

We also have a monthly home learning STEM challenge that we issue via your child's learning journal. STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics. The challenge is an opportunity for you and your child to work together at home and then share your experiences via their learning journal.

WELLBEING INDICATOR OF THE MONTH

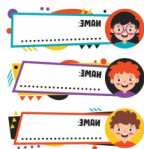
As part of our planning we also focus on a wellbeing indicator each month. This month's indicator is

LABELLING & TRAYS

Could we please ask you to check your child's tray at the end of each session and for you to label all your children's belongings especially ELC jumpers and t-shirts.



LEARNING JOURNALS

We will be continuing to use Learning Journals within the ELC. The journals provide you with updates on your child's learning and allows you to share achievements from home and comment on your child's work.

Your child's learning journal will be updated at least once per week so that you can see the learning that is taking place in the ELC.

The learning journals are set up using your personal email and each time an observation is recorded in the ELC you should receive an email notification.

New parents will be issued with a permission letter for Learning Journals when your child starts within the ELC.

If you are already signed up and having issues accessing your child's journal please let a member of the ELC staff team know.
